

Lesson 3: A New Person! Online Plan

Key Teaching Point	Those who belong to Jesus become a new person.
Bible Verse	"This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!" (2 Corinthians 5:17, NLT)
Bible Passages	"Saul becomes Paul." (Acts 9, NLT)
<u>Materials</u>	• <u>03: "A New Person" Zoom Slides</u>
Mystery Bag (Optional)	 Image 1, printed A pack of colored pencils Optional craft items: Glue Googly eyes Feathers Foam pieces



Welcome crew members.

Greet crew members as they sign on.

<u>Icebreaker Options</u> (choose <u>one</u>):

- Ask students to share their highs and lows (the best and worst things that happened to them either today or from the past week.)
- Rosebud: Ask students to share a highlight or success from the week (a rose), a challenge or disappointment from the week (a thorn) and something they are looking forward to doing or experiencing in the week ahead (a bud).
- Open a discussion with a question, "How have you changed since you were little? Since last year?"

Play a game. Guess Who?

Ask for one student to be the "mystery person." Choose a famous person or a character the kids likely know, such as Mickey Mouse, Captain America, Justin Bieber, etc. The leader should send the name of the person or character in the chat to each student EXCEPT the student designated as mystery person. Before you send the name in the chat, make sure to instruct the students NOT to read the name out loud! Then, the student who is the mystery person will ask *yes-or-no* questions from the group to try and figure out who they are. If they guess correctly with ten questions or fewer, they win! Adjust the number of questions to change the level of difficulty.

Receive God's Word.

For the following skit, you and your co-captain will each play a role: Interviewer and Paul.

Interviewer: Welcome to "Extreme Makeover" I'm your host,

{insert name}. Today, we are going to talk with Paul, formerly Saul about his recent "makeover." Paul,

thanks for coming in today!

Paul: Thanks, {insert name}, it's good to be here!

Interviewer: Paul, I would love to know, what were you like before

you met Jesus, before you became the new person

sitting in front of me today?

Paul: I truly was the worst sinner in the whole world! I

killed many of Jesus's most passionate followers. I was pretty smart too. I knew the Scriptures forwards and backwards, and I prided myself in being able to obey God's commandments more than most people.

Interviewer: Wow, you were a murderer? That is really bad!

But...the worst sinner in the whole world? Do you

really think so?

Paul: I may have obeyed all the commandments on the

outside (for other people to see of course), but my heart on the inside was evil. I didn't care about pleasing God, I only cared about being an important

and powerful person.

Interviewer: So what happened? How did you become the person

in front of me today?

Paul: It's simple. I met Jesus. Seeing and meeting him

changed me. One day, I was traveling along the road when a great bright light stopped me in my tracks. It was Jesus. I fell to the ground, only to hear a voice say to me: "Saul, why are you harassing me?" He was talking about his followers that I was seeking to kill. He told me to get up and go into the city, but the bright light coming from Jesus blinded me and I could no longer see anything else! So my companions led me into the city and for three days I was blind and

didn't eat or drink anything.

Interviewer: Wow! What happened during those three days!

Paul: I prayed, I prayed all day and all night, asking God to

heal me and asking him to forgive me. You feel helpless and weak when you can't see, eat or drink. At this point, I knew that only God could help me.

Interviewer: Then what happened?

Paul: Jesus sent a man named Ananias to me to restore my

sight. I was healed and filled with the Holy Spirit. On that day I was baptized. I left behind my old life and the old person I used to be and became a new person. If Jesus hadn't come to me, this wouldn't have been possible, but with God, all things are possible. God

can change a person from the inside out!

Interviewer: Wow, what a story! Thank you for sharing! There's

just one more question I'd like to know. Now that you've described who Saul was, how would you

describe yourself now?

Paul: Well, I'm going to answer this question a little

differently if you don't mind. When I was Saul, I loved talking about myself. Now that I'm a new person, I love to talk about Jesus more. Jesus is perfect. Everything Jesus does is pleasing to God. Jesus obeys God from the heart, and he'll even obey God if he has to die to do it. Jesus loves people and extends forgiveness and abundant life even to those who betray him or hurt his heart. God made me a new person so that I could become more and more

like Jesus each and every day!



Apply God's Truth.

Option 1 (If you are using the mystery bag): Ask students to open up their mystery bag.

I have a challenge for you all today. Using the materials in your mystery bag, I want you to make this caterpillar into something new.

Give students three minutes to decorate their caterpillar. After three minutes, allow students to share their creations with the group using their cameras.

These are really cool caterpillars...but they are still caterpillars, right? No matter how much we try to change what's on the outside, this caterpillar is still very much a caterpillar!

Option 2: (If you are not using the mystery bag): Pull up the Zoom slides for lesson 1 and share your screen.

I'm going to change this caterpillar into something new.

Flip through the other two caterpillar designs on the Zoom slides.

Ask students: Did the changes in these designs actually make this caterpillar into something new?

Take student responses.

That's right! No matter how much I try to change what's on the outside of this caterpillar, it's still a caterpillar!

Object Lesson

Show students the image of the butterfly on the Zoom slides.

This is a butterfly. A "new" caterpillar is a butterfly! When a caterpillar becomes a butterfly, it is no longer a caterpillar! It is something completely new!

God doesn't want to just change us on the outside. God isn't interested in turning sinful people into less sinful people, he wants to make us brand new! He wants to make us into a new person, a person who pleases God inside and out. This means that God wants to make us into a person who

doesn't just do and say the right things on the outside, but a person who pleases God on the inside, from the heart.

How do we become a new person? We can't become a new person by trying harder to do and say all the right things. We're usually unsuccessful, and sometimes we don't even know what's "right" anyways! Only God has the power to make us a new person from the inside out!

God's power to make us a new person is found in what Jesus has done for us. We can become a new person by trusting in what Jesus has done for us, by trusting in God's power to make us new! This is called <u>faith</u>. Jesus:

- died to experience the punishment for our sins on a cross.
- buried our sinful person in his grave.
- came back to life to give us access to a new life and to form us into a new person by God's power.
- went into heaven to give us the Holy Spirit, God's power working in us so that we can show on the outside who God has made us to be on the inside: a new person!

God's Word says this:

"This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!" (2 Corinthians 5:17, NLT)

God's power makes us a new person from the inside out. By God's power, we become a son or daughter of God instead of an enemy of God. By God's power, we become a saint instead of a sinner. By God's power, we become worthy of God's favor instead of God's punishment.

Do you want to become a new person from the inside out? Does anyone want to ask God for his power to change you from the inside out?

Close in prayer.

Lead students in the following prayer:

Dear God,

I want to become a new person. I cannot make myself a new person by trying harder, but I know that if I put my trust in Jesus, you can make me new. I believe that Jesus has paid for my sins, that Jesus has buried my sinful person in a grave, that Jesus has made me a new person on the inside and that Jesus has given me what I need to live a

life that pleases God on the outside! Thank you God for your incredible power to make me a new person!

Amen.
