Key Teaching Point Receive God's promises by faith.		





Small Group Session 1

(15 Minutes)

Distribute name tags and snacks. Choose one of the following icebreaker activities to do together while students eat their snack:

Icebreaker Options (Choose one.):

- Ask students to share their highs and lows (the best and worst things that happened to them either today or from the past week).
- Let students take turns sharing how they're feeling today using the "How Are You Feeling?" emoji chart (from the CKC Games Bag).
- As the students are eating their snacks, ask, **"What is one promise you've made that you were unable to keep?"**

Pray Together

<u>Collect prayer requests from the children</u>. Some prayer requests may emerge from the check-in time. For the first few weeks of club, the leader can model prayer time for the small group by praying for individual requests aloud.

Small Group Game: Where's the Pom-Pom?

Materials: Three plastic cups, one pom-pom, and a notepad and a pencil to keep score

Set all three cups on a table upside down. With each child getting the same number of turns, place a pom-pom underneath one of the cups, and slide the cups around in many directions, and ask the child to identify which cup hides the pom-pom. They win one point every time they guess correctly. Continue until each child has taken multiple turns.

There were three promises God made to a man named Abram long ago. Abram believed God would fulfill those promises even though he would not get to see all the promises fulfilled in his own lifetime!

Small Group Session 2

(35 Minutes)

Life Application Activity

Who can answer this riddle? What is something we get every second even if we don't see it? (Pause.) Air!

We can't see the air we breathe, but we can trust that we're receiving it. Sometimes we can't see God's promises being true, but we can trust he'll do what he promises.





Sometimes people cannot keep their promises, no matter how hard they try. Why do you think this is so?

Take student responses.

Why can we trust that God will always keep his promises?

Take student responses.

He has the knowledge and power to do what he promises. God is faithful, and he always tells the truth. God is unable to lie because that is not who he is.

Choose three volunteers for a brief experiment. Explain that you want to see how long each can hold his or her breath. Note how many seconds each person can hold their breath. Although times for each will be different, one thing will be the same for each person in this experiment.

Although each person could hold their breath for a different amount of the time, what is the same for these three?

Take student responses.

Before too long, all of them had to take a breath!

This experiment is a lot like God. But how so? Does he need to take a breath? Does he hold his breath? No. In the same way that each of us must breathe because we are alive, God must keep his promises because he is God. It is impossible for him to stop keeping his promises, just as it is impossible for us to hold our breath forever. Do you know anyone else in the whole universe who can keep all his promises? Only God can do it. He can even keep the impossible promises he makes to people.

Receive the Gift!

Worship: Agreeing with who God is and receiving that truth in song, words or actions.


Play the song: <u>God Always Keeps His Promises</u>.

Then talk about it:

• What promises of God did this song identify?

When we declare a promise that we find in God's Word during prayer it is especially powerful because we can trust that what God promises will always be kept. Let's practice this now.







Give each child an opportunity to pick out a promise from Handout 1 and model praying with them the promise of God, bearing in mind this truth:

"And we are confident that he hears us whenever we ask for anything that pleases him. And since we know he hears us when we make our requests, we also know that he will give us what we ask for." 1 John 5:14-15, NLT

Bible Verse Game

Review the Bible verse with a <u>Bible verse game</u>.

Reflection

Give each child their reflection journal. Invite them to reflect on the following questions and to record their answers in their journal. They may also draw their responses if they wish:

- 1. How do we receive gifts from God?
- 2. In what situation can I have faith like Abraham's?
